CITY OF ISHPEMING

REVOLVING LOAN FUND POLICY

- 1. The City will only participate if one or more local lending institutions are also loaning funds. A local lending institution shall mean any bank or credit union that regularly maintains an office in Marquette County, Michigan.
- 2. The City may participate in an amount to be determined by the Loan Application Committee, but in no event in an amount greater than 50% of the total new money being loaned by the local lending institution(s).
- 3. The City will have the same status as a secured party or mortgagee as the local lending institution(s).
- 4. Upon request of the City, the loan applicant or the local lending institution(s) shall furnish to the City copies of all loan application documents and lending institution(s) documents generated in connection with the loan request. All such documents shall be confidential and shall be exempt from public disclosure under the exemption granted in Section 13(1)(f) of the Michigan Freedom of Information Act [MCLA Section 15.243(1)(f)].
- 5. A permanent Loan Application Committee is hereby established, consisting of the City Manager, City Attorney, City Treasurer, and Mayor. The Loan Application Committee shall review all requests for loans from the City Revolving Loan Fund, and shall make such written recommendations as it deems prudent to the City Council regarding the loan request or any matter related thereto.
- 6. Approval or denial of a loan request from the City Revolving Loan Fund may only be given by the Ishpeming City Council.



ORDINANCE NO. 9-300

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE PURCHASE, POSSESSION OR CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES BY MINORS

THE CITY OF ISHPEMING ORDAINS:

<u>Section 9-301</u>. A person less than 21 years of age shall not purchase or attempt to purchase, or knowingly possess or consume alcoholic beverages, except as provided under Section 33a(1) of the Michigan Liquor Control Act.

<u>Section 9-302</u>. A person less than 21 years of age who violates Section 9-301 is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by the following fines:

- a) for the first violation, a fine of not more than \$100.00;
- b) for a second violation, a fine of not more than \$200.00;
- c) for a third or subsequent violation, a fine of not more than \$500.00.

Section 9-303. This ordinance shall become effective upon legal publication.

Section 9-301. Except as permitted by state law, a minor shall not purchase or attempt to purchase alcoholic liquor, consume or attempt to consume alcoholic liquor, possess or attempt to possess alcoholic liquor, or have any bodily alcohol content.

Section 9-302. Any minor who violates section 9-301 shall be punishable as follows:

- a. For the first violation a fine of not more than \$100.00 and may be ordered to participate in substance abuse prevention services or substance abuse treatment and rehabilitation services, to perform community service and to undergo substance abuse screening and assessment at his or her own expense as described in state law.
- b. For a violation following a prior conviction or juvenile adjudication for a violation of Section 9-301 or a substantially corresponding state law, by imprisonment for not more than 30 days but only if the minor has been found by the court to have violated an order of probation, failed to successfully complete any treatment, screening, or community service ordered by the court, or failed to pay any fine for that conviction or juvenile adjudication, a fine of not more than \$200.00 and may be ordered to participate in substance abuse prevention services or substance abuse treatment and rehabilitation services, to perform community service and to undergo substance abuse screening and assessment at his or her own expense as described in state law.
- For a violation following 2 or more prior convictions or juvenile adjudications for a violation of Section 9-301 or a substantially corresponding state law, by imprisonment for not more than 60 days but only if the minor has been found by the court

to have violated an order of probation, failed to successfully complete any treatment, screening, or community service ordered by the court, or failed to pay any fine for that conviction or juvenile adjudication, a fine of not more than \$500.00 and may be ordered to participate in substance abuse prevention services or substance abuse treatment and rehabilitation services, to perform community service, and to undergo substance abuse screening and assessment at his or her own expense as described in state law.

d. In accordance with and as provided in state law, when an individual who has not previously been convicted of or received a juvenile adjudication for a violation of Section 9-301 or a substantially corresponding state law pleads guilty to a violation of Section 9-301, the court, without entering a judgment of guilt and with the consent of the accused, may defer further proceedings and place the individual on probation upon terms and conditions as provided in state law. Upon violation of a term or condition of probation or upon a finding that the individual is utilizing this subsection in another court, the court may enter an adjudication of guilt and proceed as otherwise provided by law. Upon fulfillment of the terms and conditions of probation, the court shall discharge the individual and dismiss the proceedings, which shall have the same effect as provided in state law.

Section 9-303. This ordinance shall become effective on March 7, 2018 and after publication in accordance with the Charter of the City of Ishpeming.

ORDINANCE NO. 2-1500

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING ANY LOUD, UNNECESSARY OR UNUSUAL NOISE DISTURBING THE PUBLIC HEALTH, WELFARE, SAFETY, PEACE AND COMFORT

THE CITY OF ISHPEMING ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. UNLAWFUL NOISE PROHIBITED

- (A) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, business, or corporation, to make or cause any loud, unnecessary, or unusual noise, or any noise which annoys or disturbs, injures, or endangers the comfort, repose, health, peace, or safety of others within the limits of the city.
- (B) The following acts, among others, are declared to be loud, disturbing, injurious, and unnecessary and unlawful noises in violation of this section, but this enumeration shall not be deemed to be exclusive, namely:
- (1) Continuous horn, signaling devices, compression brakes, or any harsh and unreasonable loud sounds emanating from a motor vehicle;
- (2) Using radios, T.V. sets, musical instruments, loud speakers, amplifiers, or other machines or devices for the producing or reproducing of sound in a manner as to disturb the peace, quiet, and comfort of any person in the vicinity with louder volume than necessary for the person or persons who are in the room, vehicle, or chamber in which the machine or device is operating. The operation of any of the above-named devices between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. (EST) or in such a manner that the noise is plainly audible at a distance of 50 feet from the source of the noise will be prima facie evidence of a violation of this subsection;
- (3) Continuous yelling or shouting on the public street at any place or time, disturbing any person in the vicinity;
- (4) The keeping of any animal causing long and continued noises disturbing the comfort, peace, or repose of any person in the vicinity; and/or
- (5) The operation of any electric motors, compressors, or internal combustion engines on parked vehicles, or other construction equipment between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. (EST).

SECTION 2. EXCEPTIONS

None of the terms or provisions of SECTION 1 shall apply to or be enforced against:

(A) *Emergency vehicles*. Any police or fire vehicle, or ambulance while responding to, or engaged in, an emergency; and/or any Department of Public Works (DPW) trucks while engaged in snow removal or other necessary city function; and/or

(B) Special events. Any participant in a football game, parade, or other special, lawful public event.

SECTION 3. PENALTY

Any person in violation of any section of Section 1 shall be guilty of a municipal civil infraction and shall be subject to payment of a civil fine as provided in the schedule below.

- (1) First violation. Any person who admits responsibility for, or who is found responsible for, a violation of Section 1 shall be subject to a civil fine of \$50.
- (2) Second violation. Any person who admits responsibility for, or who is found responsible for, a second violation of Section 1, in any 12-month period shall be subject to a civil fine of \$100.
- (3) Third and subsequent violations. Any person who admits responsibility for, or who is found responsible for, a third or subsequent violation of Section 1, in any 12-month period shall be subject to a civil fine of \$500.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall become effective after publication in accordance with the Charter of the City of Ishpeming.

Approval of Tennis Court and Trail Grant Application

Whereas, the City of Ishpeming supports the submission of an application titled "Ishpeming Tennis Court and Trail Project" to the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund for the development of new tennis courts and a trail connection at the Ishpeming Playground Park; and

Whereas, the proposed application is supported by the Community's 5-year approved Parks and Recreation Plan; and; and

Whereas, residents of the City of Ishpeming were provided with a well-advertised opportunity to express opinions, ask questions, and discuss all aspects of the grant application at a Public meeting on March 7, 2018; and

Whereas, the public has shown strong support for this Tennis Court and Trail Project via commitment of over \$138,000 in funds donated for this purpose, to be combined with grant funds in the amount of \$300,000 for a total project cost of \$438,000; and

Whereas, the City of Ishpeming is hereby making a commitment to act as the fiduciary for the \$138,000 in private donations and ensure that they are available for the cash match; and

Whereas, the City of Ishpeming is working with the Ishpeming School District to ensure that an efficient and effective "Use and Maintenance Agreement" is in place for this project; and

Whereas, the City of Ishpeming is working with the Ishpeming School District to ensure that no encumbrances exist on this land preventing the full and free public use in perpetuity of this property for public recreation; and

Now, therefore be it resolved the City Council for the City of Ishpeming hereby authorizes the submission of a Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund application in the amount of \$300,000, and further resolves to make available its financial obligation of \$138,000 (32%) of a total \$438,000 project cost, during 2019

Be it further resolved that the City Council authorizes City Manager Mark Slown to submit the grant application on behalf of the City.

Hi Mark,

Attached is the concept plan and engineer's estimate for the tennis court project. There are a few items to note to go along with this initial estimate.


- 1. We do not have soil boring information for this area. The track area that was redone years ago had significant peat layers, which did cause a large increase in the cost of that project. If the same types of soils are present here, then creating a long lasting tennis court surface would require the same types of undercut and removal. The age of the tennis courts would indicate that there is not a heavy amount of heaving occurring currently, however. For now, an expected undercut of one additional foot for the entire pavement/tennis area is included in the estimate, however this could increase or decrease. We would recommend borings be performed near the current court area in order to provide better confidence on soil quality.
- 2. As we discussed with you prior, we have located the proposed parking stalls in a manner as to reuse the existing lighting that is currently along the north side of the tennis courts. While the lighting is likely not optimized for the parking, providing new lighting would add cost to the project that is not currently in the budget.
- 3. The current estimate, including contingencies and engineering, is over the original stated budget by approximately \$37,000, so additional funds would need to be found, or we would need to discuss reductions in the plan in order to fit within the proposed budget.
- 4. The budget includes plexipave surfacing. I've attached a brochure for the surface. The company I spoke to that deals with sports surface coatings told me that all but 1 of their high school clients throughout the state of Michigan have used this surface.
- 5. Please note that any area where we intend on working (even including the restriping area) will need to be fully controlled by the City, so if you want this work done through the grant, the exception will need to cover the entire proposed area on the plan.




