# RESOLUTION #14-2022 AUTHORIZING NOTICE OF INTENT AND DECLARING INTENT TO REIMBURSE (2023 CWSRF BONDS)

The f	following preamble and resolution were offered by Member	and

WHEREAS, the City of Ishpeming, County of Marquette, State of Michigan (the "City"), has determined that it is necessary for the public health, safety and welfare of the City to acquire, construct, furnish and equip improvements to the City's existing Sewage Disposal System (the "System"), including manhole replacements, lead service improvements and SCADA system acquisition, together with all related appurtenances and attachments thereto (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the City has been advised by the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes and Energy ("EGLE"), that financial assistance to accomplish the acquisition and construction of the Project is available through the Clean Water State Revolving Fund ("CWSRF") Loan Program administered by EGLE and the Michigan Finance Authority (the "MFA"); and

WHEREAS, the Revenue Bond Act, Act 94, Public Acts of Michigan, 1933, as amended ("Act 94"), provides a means for financing the purchase, acquisition, construction, improvement, enlargement, extension, and repair of public improvements such as the Project through the issuance of revenue bonds; and

WHEREAS, the issuance of bonds payable from revenues of the System under Act 94 in a total amount not to exceed Eight Million Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$8,025,000) (the "Bonds"), for the purpose of financing all or part of the Project represents the most practical means to that end; and

WHEREAS, the City has made application for participation in the CWSRF loan program; and

WHEREAS, a notice of intent to issue revenue bonds must be published before the issuance of the Bonds in order to comply with the requirements of Section 33 of Act 94; and

WHEREAS, the City intends at this time to state its intentions to be reimbursed from proceeds of the Bonds for any expenditures undertaken by the City for the Project prior to issuance of the Bonds.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish a notice of intent to issue the Bonds in *The Mining Journal*, a newspaper of general circulation in the City.
- 2. The notice of intent shall be published as a display advertisement not less than one-quarter (1/4) page in size in substantially the form attached to this resolution as Exhibit A.
- 3. The City Council does hereby determine that the foregoing form of Notice of Intent to Issue Bonds, and the manner of publication directed, is adequate notice to the electors of the City and users of the System and the City's taxpayers and electors, and is the method best calculated to give them notice of the City's intent to issue the Bonds, the purpose of the Bonds, the security for the Bonds, and the right of referendum of the electors with respect thereto, and the newspaper named for publication is hereby determined to reach the largest number of persons to whom the notice is directed.
- 4. The City makes the following declarations for the purpose of complying with the reimbursement rules of Treas. Reg. § 1.150-2 pursuant to the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended:
  - (a) As of the date hereof, the City reasonably expects to reimburse the City for the expenditures described in (b) below with proceeds of debt to be incurred by the City.
  - (b) The expenditures described in this paragraph (b) are for the costs of acquiring and constructing the Project which were or will be paid subsequent to sixty (60) days prior to the date hereof.
  - (c) The maximum principal amount of debt expected to be issued for the Project, including issuance costs, is \$8,025,000.
- 5. The Mayor, City Clerk, City Treasurer, City Manager and Finance Director are each authorized to act as an authorized officer or designated representative in connection with the Project and execute and deliver such applications, documents or certificates with EGLE, the MFA or other entities as may be necessary or advisable to enable the City to issue and sell the Bonds as contemplated herein and to meet its obligations under the CWSRF loan program.
- 6. The City hereby confirms the retention of Miller, Canfield, Paddock and Stone, P.L.C. ("Miller Canfield"), as bond counsel in connection with the Bonds. The City has been advised that Miller Canfield has represented the MFA in the past and may be representing the MFA presently in connection with various matters including the CWSRF loan program and the City consents to the representation of the MFA by Miller Canfield in connection with the CWSRF loan program that may be utilized by the City in connection with the Bonds.
- 7. All resolutions and parts of resolutions insofar as they conflict with the provisions of this resolution be and the same hereby are rescinded.

# NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS AND ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF ISHPEMING AND TO USERS OF THE CITY'S SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEM OF INTENT TO ISSUE REVENUE BONDS AND THE RIGHT OF REFERENDUM RELATING THERETO

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the City Council of the City of Ishpeming, County of Marquette, State of Michigan (the "City"), intends to issue and sell revenue bonds pursuant to Act 94, Public Acts of Michigan, 1933, as amended, in a total amount not to exceed Eight Million Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$8,025,000), for the purpose of paying all or part of the cost to acquire, construct, furnish and equip improvements to the City's existing Sewage Disposal System, including manhole replacements, lead service improvements and SCADA system acquisition, together with all related appurtenances and attachments thereto.

#### SOURCE OF PAYMENT OF REVENUE BONDS

THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THE REVENUE BONDS SHALL BE PAYABLE solely from the revenues received by the City from the operations of the Sewage Disposal System (the "System"). The revenues will consist of rates and charges billed to the users of the System, a schedule of which is presently on file in the office of the City Clerk. The rates and charges may from time to time be revised to provide sufficient revenues to provide for the expenses of operating and maintaining the System, to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds and to pay other obligations of the System.

#### **BOND DETAILS**

THE REVENUE BONDS will be payable in annual installments not to exceed thirty (30) in number and will bear interest at the rate or rates to be determined at public or private sale but in no event to exceed such rates as may be permitted by law on the unpaid balance from time to time remaining outstanding on said bonds.

IN THE EVENT THAT THE CITY DEEMS IT DESIRABLE TO SELL THE REVENUE BONDS TO THE MICHIGAN FINANCE AUTHORITY, THE CITY MAY ALSO PLEDGE ITS LIMITED TAX FULL FAITH AND CREDIT AS SECURITY FOR THE BONDS. IN SUCH CASE, IF REVENUES OF THE SYSTEM ARE INSUFFICIENT TO PAY DEBT SERVICE AT ANY TIME, THEN TO PAY DEBT SERVICE THE CITY SHALL ADVANCE LEGALLY AVAILABLE FUNDS INCLUDING, IF NECESSARY, FUNDS FROM THE LEVY OF TAXES UPON ALL TAXABLE PROPERTY IN THE CITY, SUBJECT HOWEVER TO CONSTITUTIONAL, STATUTORY AND CHARTER TAX RATE LIMITATIONS. IN ADDITION, THE CITY MAY BE REQUIRED TO PLEDGE FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE BONDS MONEY RECEIVED OR TO BE RECEIVED BY THE CITY DERIVED FROM IMPOSITION OF TAXES BY THE STATE AND RETURNED OR TO BE RETURNED TO THE CITY AS PROVIDED BY LAW, except for money the use of which is prohibited for such purposes by the State Constitution. The City may enter into an agreement providing for the payment of taxes, which taxes are collected by the State and returned to the City as provided by law, to the authority or a trustee, and such funds may be pledged for the payment of the revenue bonds.

#### RIGHT OF REFERENDUM

THE REVENUE BONDS WILL BE ISSUED WITHOUT A VOTE OF THE ELECTORS UNLESS A PETITION REQUESTING SUCH A VOTE SIGNED BY NOT LESS THAN 10% OF THE REGISTERED ELECTORS OF THE CITY IS FILED WITH THE CITY CLERK WITHIN FORTY-FIVE (45) DAYS AFTER PUBLICATION OF THIS NOTICE. IF SUCH PETITION IS FILED, THE BONDS MAY NOT BE ISSUED WITHOUT AN APPROVING VOTE OF A MAJORITY OF THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE CITY VOTING THEREON.

THIS NOTICE is given pursuant to the requirements of Section 33, Act 94, Public Acts of Michigan, 1933, as amended.

Perfluoroalkyl and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS) are a growing environmental concern to the State of Michigan. These man-made chemicals have been widely used in industry and consumer products since the 1950's, and are most commonly associated with food packaging, non-stick coatings, plating operations, firefighting foams, and stain- and water-resistant treatments for clothing, furniture, and carpet. Due to their unique chemical properties, PFAS are very mobile in groundwater and do not readily break down.

Based on the potential for PFAS containing material to have been disposed of at the Negaunee-Ishpeming Landfill (Landfill) and combined with the facts that there is known groundwater contamination associated with the Landfill, the Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE) has determined that it is necessary to determine if PFAS contamination is present at the Landfill at levels that require further action.

To determine whether PFAS is present in concentrations of concern, EGLE is requesting that the following locations be sampled and analyzed for PFAS constituents:

Monitoring Wells:

MW-1

MW-2

MW-3

Sampling these locations would likely provide insight as to the potential for a PFAS plume to be associated with the Landfill.

The above-referenced sample locations should be analyzed for PFAS constituents listed in the enclosed EGLE PFAS Minimum Laboratory Analyte List. If PFAS is detected at the sample locations, it is likely that additional sampling would be required.

EGLE recently established cleanup criteria for PFAS under Part 201, Environmental Remediation of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451 as amended. Due to the extremely low laboratory method detection limits required by Part 201 PFAS cleanup criteria, special protocol needs to be followed when sampling for PFAS. Sampling guidance can be found at EGLE's website at <a href="https://www.michigan.gov/pfasresponse">www.michigan.gov/pfasresponse</a>, and then by clicking "Testing and Treatment," followed by "PFAS Sampling Guidance." A list of accredited laboratories capable of analyzing for the Michigan EGLE PFAS Minimum Analyte List can also be found at the website.

Please respond to this office to my attention, no later than October 28, 2022, regarding your willingness to conduct this sampling. At that time, we can discuss the need for a work plan and summary report associated with this sampling event.

In accordance with Section 12-102 of Ordinance #12-100 below, the City will not be thawing the water line or allowing a let run at this property until measures are taken to prevent it from freezing. The water line at this location needs to be insulated and/or buried deeper. Please contact me at 906-250-0979 when this is completed or if you have any questions

ORDINANCE NO. 12-100 Section 12-102

(b) In the event that any user or consumer of water experiences a freeze-up of underground water lines or pipes during the winter months, the City Water Utility may provide thawing service from the water main to curb stop valve at no charge to the customer. See Annual Fee Schedule to thaw a water service from the curb stop valve to the water meter.

(c)No consumer, user or service receiving water from the City Water Utility shall be authorized to "let-run" the water in any property during the winter months unless written permission has been issued by the Operator in Charge.

Before the Operator in Charge shall issue such permission to let-run, the user or consumer shall make a request therefor and shall establish to the satisfaction of the Operator in Charge that the water lines in question cannot be prevented from freeze-up by wrapping in insulation, attachment of heat cables, or the application of any other reasonable means which the Operator in Charge may direct in an effort to alleviate a freeze-up problem. The Operator in Charge is specifically authorized to direct that the user or consumer requesting a "let-run" shall insulate the water lines or attach heat cables thereto, or take such other reasonable precautions to prevent freeze-ups, at the expense of the person requesting the "let-run".
