We are pleased to inform you that your 2023 SROGP application to the Michigan State Police (MSP), Grants and Community Services Division, Office of School Safety (OSS), has been selected to receive funding. The award for your project, pending the finalization of the Grant Agreement (contract), is \$186,425.

Congratulations on your award. Nearly \$45 million in funding requests were received for \$25 million in available funds. A panel consisting of representatives from education and law enforcement awarded the grants, giving priority to school districts, intermediate school districts, and public school academies without a school resource officer (SRO) currently in place. The panel also considered student enrollment as a factor in the awards – prioritizing those with lower enrollment.

You will receive your grant agreement (contract) and instructions on how it must be submitted back on or before February 15, 2023. Once received, it is crucial that you read through the entire contract to be sure all grant officials are aware of and able to abide by the grant requirements. Contract requirements will be enforced, and noncompliance may result in grant suspension and/or financial penalties.

Additionally, a signed Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between your district and partnering law enforcement agency must be submitted to the OSS within 30 days of the start date of your contract (which can be from August 1, 2022, through August 1, 2023). Please see the <u>Memorandum of Understanding Fact Sheet</u> from the United States Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services for information on developing an MOA. Remember, this is a reimbursement-only grant, and reimbursements will not be approved until our office receives your signed contract and MOA.

The MSP strongly encourages training for SROs placed under this program and will be providing Teaching, Educating, and Mentoring schools in February, May, and September 2023 as well as hosting the NASRO Basic SRO Course, which must be accessed through MI-Train with the course number 1107990. We will also be hosting the NASRO Advanced SRO course with details to be provided at a later date.



Purpose: Hiring Options for New Police Officer/School Resource Officer Grant

Working with the Ishpeming School District, we were able to secure a portion of the 2023 School Resource Officer Grant Program funding through the State of Michigan. The State of Michigan awarded us \$186,425 which will be matched by the Ishpeming Public School District. If accepted by council this will allow our department to create a full time SRO position for the next three years, paid in full by the grant (Salary plus benefits). I have attached the award letter from the State of Michigan.

I am asking that council accept the grant position and allow me to put a second cadet through the upcoming academy. The second cadet would be hired on as a full-time temporary position for three-years. The SRO will be chosen from our current officers with at least 3 years of experience (This process has been approved by the Officer's Union). By allowing our department to put a second recruit through the academy, our current road patrol coverage would not be interrupted.

If a second cadet is approved by council, I will apply for an MCOLES Public Safety Assistance Program grant. This grant will cover the full cost of the Academy for that cadet. The City would be responsible for the cadet's wages plus benefits while that cadet is in the Academy. The wage cost for the City would roughly be \$11,065.60.

If a second recruit is not approved, we could still make the SRO position work. However, this option would take away from road coverage for the next three years.




The Ishpeming Public School has made a request the vacation of the alley between lots 85 and 86, Cleveland Iron Co.'s Addition and has requested the purchase of lot 85 from the City of Ishpeming for the proposed development of a playlot which would include parking, basketball court, playground structure and volleyball area. The following is the three step process:

- 1. February Council Meeting Council passes a resolution (motion) to dispose of the lot and the alley as Surplus, using the considerations in the new Land Sales Policy, and sets a time for a Public Hearing.
- **2.** March Council Meeting Conduct the public hearing as to both vacating the alley and selling the lot.
- 3. April Council Meeting Council passes a resolution to dispose of (sell) the lot with vacated half of the alley, approves the Purchase Agreement for the vacant city lot, and authorizes the Mayor and Manager or Clerk to sign.

The City Manager recommends the Council declare lot 85 and the alley between lots 85 and 86 as surplus and set the public hearing for the March 8, 2023 regular City Council meeting.

The Planning Commissioner's unanimously recommended to the City Council that this alley be vacated.



Constraints

The current size of the bucket is 42 inches. Operator must dig on both sides of a watermain to allow the crew to work safely in the hole. The bottom of the hole would need to be 8 feet wide and the top (at the road surface) would be 16 feet with a 2 to 1 slope.

The new bucket is 30 inches. Bottom of the hole would now be 5 feet wide and 10 feet at the road surface.

Resolution to Adopt Poverty Exemption Income Guidelines and Asset Test

WHEREAS, the homestead of persons who, in the judgment of the Assessor and Board of Review, by reason of poverty, are unable to contribute to the public charges is eligible for exemption in whole or part from taxation under the General Property Tax Act; and

WHEREAS, the City Council is required by Section 7u of the General Property Tax Act, Public Act 206 of 1893 (MCL 211.7u), to adopt guidelines for poverty exemptions;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, pursuant to MCL 211.7u, that the City of Ishpeming, Marquette County, adopts the following guidelines for the Assessor and Board of Review to implement.

The guidelines shall include but not be limited to the specific income and asset levels of the claimant and all persons residing in the household, including any property tax credit returns, filed in the current or immediately preceding year.

To be eligible, a person shall do all the following on an annual basis

- 1) Be an owner of and occupy as a homestead the property for which an exemption is requested.
- 2) File a claim with the Assessor or Board of Review, accompanied by federal and state income tax returns for all persons residing in the homestead, including any property tax credit returns filed in the immediately preceding year or in the current year.
- 3) Produce a valid drivers' license or other form of identification if requested.
- 4) Produce a deed, land contract, or other evidence of ownership of the property for which an exemption is requested if requested.
- 5) Meet the federal poverty income guidelines as defined and determined annually by the United States Office of Management and Budget as attached.
- 6) Meet additional eligibility requirements as determined by the City Council, including maximum asset value and asset test policies as attached.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED that the Board of Review shall follow the above stated policy and federal guidelines in granting or denying an exemption, unless the Board of Review determines there are substantial and compelling reasons why there should be a deviation from the policy and federal guidelines and these are communicated in writing to the claimant.

- Bank accounts (over a specified amount), stocks
- Money received from the sale of property such as stocks, bonds, a house, or a car (unless a person is in the business of selling such property).
- Withdrawals of bank deposits and borrowed money
- Gifts, loans, lump-sum inheritances and one-time insurance payments.
- Food or housing received in lieu of wages and the value of food and fuel produced and consumed on farms.
- Federal non-cash benefits programs such as Medicare, Medicaid, food stamps, and school lunches.
