### 1. CUPPAD - Emily Soucy: Master Plan Review and Comments

Ryan was not present and was represented by his wife Emily. Brooke commented on the closure of the Empire Mine – Pg. 7 and more recreational emphasis Pg. 8. Lindsay encouraged more recreational emphasis as well as Motorized and Non-motorized Trails as well as RAMBA & IOHT. She also thought the "Love and Regret" portion (pg. 9) was out of place. Lindsay offered help with Adobe formatting, if necessary, and that the City is now attracting younger families. The picture on Page 15 is not in Ishpeming. Continuing Recreational Trail Development is an important economic factor for Ishpeming. Lindsay suggested several adjective revisions substituting "historic" for attractive, "innovation" for culturally rich, "tradesman " for tradesperson. Brooke felt that our recreational opportunities were not mentioned enough. Emily thanked Commissioners for their review and comments.

There was discussion regarding Ishpeming's efforts to obtain the Re-development Ready Community (RRC) status and its benefits, the Wabash Height's Subdivision opposition to development, the "Egg Beater", the Marquette County Climate Adaptation Study, and EV charging stations.

### 2. Malton Road Recreation and Development

There was general discussion of Malton Road potential campground. There would be no development on the West side, but the East side is proposed for 28 Rustic Camp Sites. UPEA is developing a site plan. This appears to be a plan in process.

## 3. Review of Draft Marihuana Application Form (hand out at meeting)

Al displayed a draft form about 7' long (8-10 pages total) in draft form that is ready for typing and proofing. There will be statutory delays for revisions of the Zoning Ordinance to work in tandem with the applications. As we are only allowing 2 locations in the City, we must be prepared to process without delays. The final form has only about one hour of typing performed so far. The details and time frames for adoption were discussed.
