

## A NEW NORMAL

2021 was filled with highs and lows, as is any year. We began March with a surprise opening after being closed for nearly an entire year. It was wonderful re-opening our doors to our community and being able to interact directly once again. We recreated our Summer Reading Program to take place entirely outside and have embraced the concept of Take & Makes, which have been extraordinarily well received. We've slowly reintroduced in-person programs for adults, and look forward to doing so for youth programs in the near future.

We ended the year with the losses of Linda Peterson, former Library Director of 26 years, and Ray Leverton, who single-handedly raised over half of a million dollars for renovations at the library to ensure handicap accessibility and energy efficient updates. They will both be missed, though their legacies continue at the library.

An exciting end of the year introduction was Beanstack, an app featuring reading challenges for all ages. We can't wait to see its use grow!

Looking forward into 2022 and beyond there are several projects we'd like to consider: an update to the Children's Room (particularly shelving) would make the space much more user-friendly, a restoration to the main desk, improvements to our Teen Loft, reorganizing storage spaces, repair/replacement of flooring, and, finally, improvement to our HVAC systems will be necessary sooner rather than later. Far off plans could include digitizing our local history holdings, making them available for researchers virtually.



The number and character of items checked out during this year.



1,336 took part in our programs for kids, including outdoor storytimes, drop-in crafts, and Take & Makes.







We had 152 attendees at Zoom programs such as Tween and Teen Book Clubs, and storytimes once we switched from Facebook Live in the Fall.





3,975 eBooks were circulated across four shared collections accessible through the Great Lakes Digital Library site or the Libby app. 798 magazines circ'd.





82 book reviews were submitted!








